

This program is targeted for children aged 6-12, but all children accompanied by an adult are welcome to attend.



## Walk your Block in La Perle

Living in a safe community is important to us in La Perle, keeping our neighborhood safe can be as easy as going for a walk!

Research has shown that crime is significantly reduced where residents are visibly present and are actively involved on their streets and in their neighborhoods. Individuals out randomly walking are more effective than scheduled citizen patrols.

When individuals are aware of their neighborhood, they are better equipped to recognize and respond when something is not "right".

#### So What is "Walk your Block"?

Who? You walk your block
How? Take a walk
Where? In your neighborhood
When? Whenever you like
Why? To prevent crime before it happens



#### Benefits & Value Of Walk Your Block

#### As a City

- Decrease crime. Crime is difficult to perpetrate if people are out walking and watching
- Less police resources needed for property crime
- Economic benefits: taxes, insurance premiums, human resources


#### In the Community

## **Hosting a Summer Block Party**

Block Parties are a fun way to meet your neighbors, re-establish old friendships, increase a sense of belonging, create connections, and promote safety and prevent crime!

To start, find at least 1 or 2 neighbors to help you organize - begin planning 4-5 weeks ahead of the event. Decide what kind of block party you wish to have: BBQ, picnic, potluck, or catered.

Determine where you want to host the event - how large do you want to make it, can guests invite friends? You'll need to apply for a permit if the block party will be on the street, alley or park.

Get the word out - Draw up invitations and go door to door or drop them in mailboxes, call or email neighbors if you have their contact information, extend an invitation if you see them out mowing their lawn, etc.

**Block Party Permit Applications** can be found on the City of Edmonton website, along with a handy **Block Party Kit** with tips and tricks for organizing a block party.

Try not to go overboard, it can make people feel the event is too much work. Keep it simple and have FUN!

**Step 1** – Download the CommuniBee App, either from the Google Play or Apple App Store


**Step 2** – Sign up for a free account
