 Some work has been done on the bylaws. A committee needs to be formed to thoroughly go through the bylaws and update them to meet our current needs.
- 9.0 Presentation by Connie Marciniuk & Constable Corinne Kline
 Connie works with Community Safety Initiatives in Citizen Services with the City of Edmonton.
 Constable Corinne Kline has been a police officer with the Edmonton Police Service for 19 years; her current focus is community engagement events.

Connie and Corinne do presentations to communities based around safety in that specific community. They provide information about why crime occurs in the neighbourhood, target rich environments, and strategies that can be implemented to make the neighbourhood a safer place.

They have offered to do one of these presentations specifically for La Perle. Corinne has also offered to host a "coffee with a cop" session.

They also reminded to report all suspicious activity. EPS keeps a record of all complaints - If they don't know about crime occurring in the neighbourhood then they cannot address or respond to it.

10.0 Treasurer's Address

Financial Statements

- Membership and hall rental revenue is up.
- We received a grant from the city that was put towards some renovations that were done at the hall in the previous year.
- Stucco and Parking Lot Lighting Project we have received the ½ half of funding for this project (the provincial grant). By end of June 2020 we should receive the remaining funding from the city.
- Casino was in December 2019, we received the funding in February 2020. We run most of the community league from these funds.

Budget

- due to Covid-19 and AGM being rescheduled from April, we are already half way through our 2020/2021 fiscal year.
- Budget has been adjusted to account for decreased revenue from hall rental and soccer due to closure and cancellations caused by Covid-19.
- \$5000 has been budgeted to assist Belmead keep their rink open. It's a coalition of 4 other community leagues in the West End that support Belmead. We do not use our rinks because they are needing to be replaced. We are looking at a cost of \$20000/rink for demolition and a minimum of \$90000 to build one rink.
- We have suspended all big plans because of Covid-19. We are not moving ahead on the Stucco and Parking Lot Lighting project until we have received both grants.
- Soccer program is self-sufficient so if no revenue stream, no expenses.
- We are eligible for the programs that the Federal government is offering for Covid-19 relief; we are exploring all options at this time.

- Possibility that project might be funded in the fall by provincial government, they are looking at doing infrastructure stimulus funding because of Covid-19 and are looking for projects that are shovel ready

Edmonton Transit

- ridership is currently at 40% of pre Covid-19 amounts
- city is only using the busses that have driver safety shields installed
- currently running a modified Saturday schedule all week; as things progress they will slowly add back route frequency

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Description of Board Positions

La Perle Community League – Role Descriptions

The President

- Supervises the affairs of the Board
- When present, chairs all meetings of the Society, the Board, and the Executive Committee
- Is an ex-officio member of all Committees, except the Nominating Committee
- Acts as the spokesperson for the Society or appoints a designate
- Chairs the Executive Committee, and carries out other duties as assigned by the Board, such as signing authority

The Vice-President:

- Presides at meetings in the President's absence. If the Vice-President is absent, the Directors elect a Chairperson for the meeting
- Replaces the President at various functions when asked to do so by the President or the Board
- Is responsible for the annual review of the Bylaws, Policies and Procedures
- Is a member of the Executive Committee, and is a signing authority
- Is generally responsible for overseeing the operations of the properties of the League and carries out other duties assigned by the Board.



The Treasurer

- Makes sure all monies paid to the Society are deposited in a chartered bank, treasury branch or trust company chosen by the Board
- Makes sure a detailed account of revenues and expenditures is presented at every Board and General Meeting
- Makes sure an audited statement of the financial position of the Society is prepared and presented at the Annual General Meeting
- Chairs the Finance Committee of the Board
- Is a member of the Executive Committee, and carries out other duties assigned by the Board





The Secretary

- Attends all meetings of the Society, the Board and the Executive Committee
- Keeps accurate minutes of these meetings
- Has charge of minute book and other records
- Has charge of the Board's correspondence under the direction of the President and the Board
- Makes sure all notices of various meetings are sent
- Makes sure annual fees are collected and deposited
- Keeps the Seal of the Society
- Files the annual return, changes in the directors of the organization, amendments in the bylaws and other incorporating documents with the Corporate Registry and carries out other duties assigned by the Board.





Membership Director

- Is responsible for the organization, timing and completion of the annual Membership campaign
- Keeps a record of and maintains the membership lists and other records pertaining to membership
- Ensures compliance with the EFCL Code of Ethics with respect to selling memberships
- Prepares an annual budget for membership and submits it to the Treasurer
- Reviews and prepares policy and procedures with respect to membership and reports monthly to the Board of Directors

Events Director

- Is responsible for all events, including talent competitions, Community League Day,
 Winter Festival, etc.
- Prepares an annual budget for programs and submits it to the Treasurer
- Reviews and prepares policy and procedures with respect to programs, and reports monthly to the Board of Directors.





Social Director

- Is responsible for all matters pertaining to social activities of the League, including dances, social nights, etc.
- Prepares an annual budget for social activities and submits it to the Treasurer
- Reviews and prepares policy and procedures with respect to social activities, and reports monthly to the Board of Directors.

Crime Prevention Director

- Liaises with the Edmonton Police Service and other safety and crime prevention organizations
- Is responsible for all matters pertaining to community safety and security concerns and reports monthly to the Board of Directors.





Communications Director

- Is responsible for the publication of the newsletter and participates in collecting articles for the newsletter
- Oversees the delivery of the newsletter
- Manages social media channels
- Arranges for publicity via the newsletter & social media for league events
- Prepares an annual budget for publicity and submits it to the Treasurer
- Reviews and prepares policy and procedures with respect to publicity, and reports monthly to the Board of Directors.

Website Director

- Is responsible for the maintenance of the League website
- Arranges for publicity for league events
- Prepares an annual budget for the web site and submits it to the Treasurer
- Reviews and prepares policy and procedures with respect to publicity, and reports monthly to the Board of Directors.





Casino Director

- Is responsible for organizing volunteer efforts for the Society's casino fundraiser
- Is responsible for communicating with AGLC regarding logistics of operating the Society's casino fundraiser
- Reports monthly to the Board of Directors.

Director at Large

- Is responsible for attending all meetings of the Board of Directors with full voting rights, similar to other Directors.
- Participates in ad hoc Board of Directors activities
